Organizational Visits



On the 4th of April, 2025, the interns of the SMART India Foundation undertook an expedition to the Poornathreyeesha Old Age Home, driven by the imperative of community engagement. Their aims encompassed a comprehensive grasp of the home's operational dynamics, personal interaction with its elderly residents, and the exploration of potential avenues for assistance.

A warm reception awaited the interns, who immersed themselves in the history, mission, and services provided by the home, while engaging in substantive dialogues with the inhabitants. Conversations with staff illuminated the multifaceted challenges faced and the requisite support necessary. The visit yielded profound insights into the existence of the elderly and the steadfast dedication of caregivers, underscoring 7the paramount significance of empathy and community investment.

The SMART India Foundation remains unwavering in its dedication to continue bolstering such establishments through initiatives of voluntarism and heightened awareness.





On 5th April 2025, the SMART Interns visited the Relief Settlement in Palluruthy, a rehabilitation center for psychiatric patients. The aim was to provide social work students with hands-on experience in understanding mental health care services.

During the visit, interns engaged with staff and inmates, gaining insight into the operations and support mechanisms of psychiatric rehabilitation. Students learned about the needs of psychiatric patients, the framework of mental health centers, the critical role of social workers, and the real-world application of their theoretical knowledge.

Overall, the visit significantly enriched the interns' awareness of the complexities surrounding psychiatric care, which will be beneficial in their future social work practice.





On the 10th of April, 2025, a cohort of social work scholars embarked on a visitation to Don Bosco Boys Home as part of their experiential fieldwork. This initiative, orchestrated by SMART Interns, sought to illuminate for the students the operational dynamics of organizations dedicated to assisting disadvantaged children.

The students engaged in dialogue with both staff and residents, assimilated information regarding the array of services offered, and examined the multifaceted needs of boys residing in institutional care.

Don Bosco Boys Home provides sanctuary for boys hailing from precarious backgrounds through the provision of shelter, educational opportunities, counseling, and life skills development. Throughout the visit, the students interacted with a variety of staff members, had informal exchanges with the boys, traversed the facilities, and deliberated on intervention methodologies.





This visit enabled students to deepen their comprehension of social work principles, align theoretical knowledge with practical application, and appreciate the myriad challenges confronting children under care. Collectively, the experience augmented their understanding of child welfare and underscored the indispensable function of social workers in advocacy and support.



Media Insights and Ethical Frameworks: Interns Learn the Ropes at Rashtradeepika

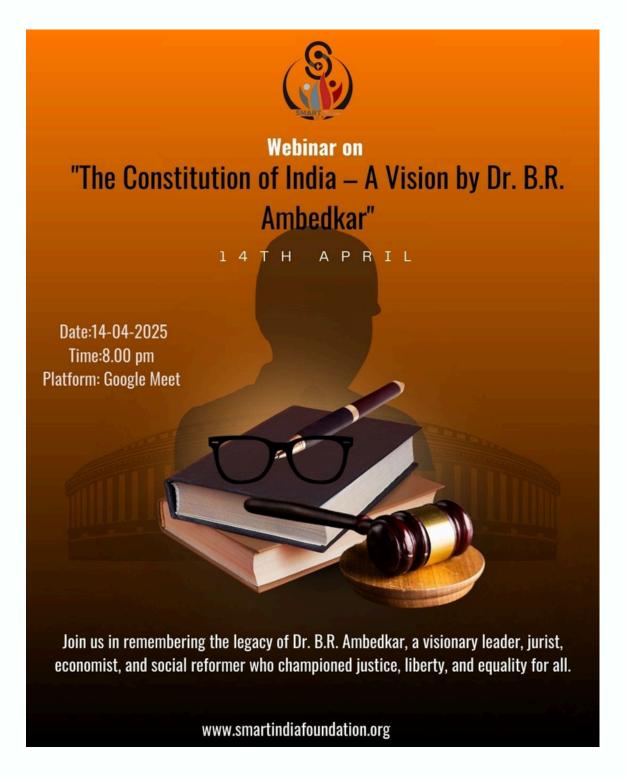

The Smart India Foundation commemorated Ambedkar Jayanti on 14th April 2025 to pay tribute to the birth anniversary of Dr B.R. Ambedkar, the chief architect of the Indian Constitution and a respected leader who devoted his life to supporting labourers, women, and disenfranchised communities.

The event commenced with a PowerPoint presentation that showcased Dr. Ambedkar's life, accomplishments, and significant contribution to the drafting of the Indian Constitution. The session featured an in-depth overview of the essential components, sections, and timelines of the Constitution, promoting awareness and comprehension among those involved.

Members of the Smart India Foundation were actively involved in creating posters and announcements to celebrate the event. A reflective discussion session took place, during which participants contemplated Dr. Ambedkar's challenges and his significant impact on social reform and justice.



A quiz contest focused on the life and legacy of Dr. Ambedkar was held, with enthusiastic involvement playing a major role in the event's success. The event acted as an inspiring reminder of Dr. Ambedkar's lasting legacy and strengthened the Foundation's dedication to social equality and education.

Students Shed Light on Mental Health Issues in Kerala, Emphasizing Need for Awareness



Social Work students from the SMART India Foundation conducted a survey in Kerala to study mental health issues and awareness. The survey, spanning various age groups in urban and rural areas, revealed high stress levels, stigma toward seeking help, and low awareness of mental health mmm services. Students gained practical skills and a deeper understanding of mental health applications in real life, fostering empathy and commitment to promoting awareness.

The findings revealed that over 60% of participants experienced frequent stress, while many still held stigmas around seeking mental health care. Awareness of available services was low, especially in rural areas. Youth commonly reported stress from exams and social pressure, whereas elderly participants often felt isolated and emotionally unsupported.







The SMART India Foundation orchestrated a profound and enlightening interactive session on 9th April 2025, under the aegis of Mr. Francis Moothedan, an esteemed authority in addiction recovery.

This initiative was specifically tailored for SMART interns to enhance their comprehension of addiction and the intricacies of rehabilitation.

Mr. Francis Moothedan imparted a deeply personal and experiential viewpoint during the session. Drawing from his extensive tenure in addiction counseling and rehabilitation, he recounted compelling narratives and authentic case studies that illuminated the multifaceted nature of addiction and the myriad challenges encountered by individuals striving for recovery.





Whilst addressing the origins, progression, and therapeutic modalities surrounding addiction, the crux of the session resided in his sagas—providing a rare and candid insight into the tribulations faced by those ensnared by substance dependency. His methodology underscored the virtues of compassion, patience, and the paramount significance of human connectivity in the healing continuum.

The interns were particularly touched by his accounts of metamorphosis and resilience. His contemplations accentuated the pivotal roles of attentive listening, communal support, and persistent endeavor in the voyage toward de-addiction

The session transcended mere informational discourse, emerging as a profound emotional experience, inspiring interns to approach the subject of addiction with empathy rather than scorn.





The SMART Interns organized an awareness session for social work students on May 1, 2025, aligning with International Workers' Day to mark World Day for Safety and Health at Work. Led by Ms. Sufiya Rai under the guidance of Ms. katherine, the event aimed to educate students on workplace health and safety standards, emphasizing the rights and responsibilities of employers and employees.

The session included:

- Global and local significance of occupational safety and health
- Key safety measures for risk prevention
- Real-world examples showcasing effective practices
- Segment on Labour Welfare Legislation by Ms. Thajunnesa





Interactive discussions highlighted practical applications of safety standards across sectors, fostering a safety-conscious mindset among students. The Department commends the student team's initiative, especially Ms. Sufiya Rai's leadership in content development.

This initiative reinforces the institution's commitment to nurturing socially responsible professionals well-versed in human-centric workplace policies and practices.





The SMART India Foundation adeptly orchestrated a stakeholder interview for its interns on the 8th of April, 2025, featuring Dr. Smitha Pillai, an esteemed International Yoga Therapist and Mentor at the Five Points International Yoga Studio in Kochi. This session is intended to delve into the multidisciplinary links between yoga and social work, bestowing invaluable insights for fledgling social workers.

Dr. Pillai underscored the significant influence yoga can exert on both the personal and professional growth of individuals immersed in social work. Nurturing Health, Confidence & Safety

Workshop for adolescent girls on menstrual hygiene, selfesteem, and personal safety

8 April 2025 10 am

At Sevasadanam Thrissur





On the 8th of April 2025, interns of the SMART India Foundation embarked on an enlightening visit to the Sevasadanam Orphanage in Thrissur as an integral component of their community outreach initiative. They presented a collection of sanitary napkins, generously contributed by the entire cohort, to promote menstrual hygiene among the adolescent girls residing within the institution.

An informative awareness session was conducted, centering on menstrual hygiene, the cultivation of self-confidence, and personal safety. This session sought to dismantle the entrenched taboos surrounding menstruation, equip the girls with knowledge of proper hygiene practices, and empower them through awareness of self-care and safety protocols.

The interns fostered an environment conducive to open dialogue, systematically addressing widespread misconceptions and responding to inquiries from the attendees.





The girls participated enthusiastically, sharing their narratives and apprehensions, while the orphanage officials conveyed their profound appreciation for both the valuable donations and the enlightening session. This visit proved to be an enriching experience for both the interns and the orphanage residents, underscoring the significance of menstrual health awareness and the empowerment of adolescents. This undertaking represented yet another stride in the interns' unwavering commitment to social responsibility and communal welfare.







On the 24th of April 2025, the SMART Interns cohort embarked on a preliminary investigation on Kari Island as a preparatory measure for the forthcoming summer camp. During their excursion, they engaged with Mr. Ajith Michel to discern and evaluate the extant local resources conducive to the camp's success.

Furthermore, the team undertook familial visits to apprise parents and guardians regarding the camp while extending personal invitations for their attendance at the Programme. They also liaised with local leaders to cultivate community support and active participation in the initiative.





The SMART Kids initiative, a progressive endeavor under the aegis of the SMART platform, aspires to bolster the educational journey of school students. Acknowledging that this phase is frequently characterized by academic rigors, the exigencies of personal growth, and the pressures of future planning, the project seeks to implement specific interventions.

To ensure that the project's design adequately reflects the genuine needs of students, a comprehensive social need assessment was undertaken by SMART interns among diverse demographics from the public during April 21 and 22, 2025.





The SMART Interns conducted a SWOT analysis on elderly individuals as part of their academic and field training. The analysis aimed to deepen the students' understanding of the challenges and capabilities of this target group while enhancing their grasp of social work theories and practices.

The SWOT analysis revealed strengths such as rich life experience, strong value systems, and family and community bonds. Weaknesses included physical and mental health decline, economic dependency, social isolation, and limited digital literacy. Opportunities included growing focus on elderly care in government and NGO policies, community programs, training, and development of elder-friendly infrastructure.

Threats included increasing neglect, rising healthcare costs, social stigma, and a lack of inclusive public policies for elderly welfare.
